I Can Only Imagine, by Bart Millard- The local church has been charged with the mission of sharing the hope of the gospel, but this mission can be challenging in a relentlessly broken world. How can you restore hope when someone feels rejected, guilty, or broken? Before he became the lead singer of MercyMe, Bart Millard suffered a painful childhood. Abused by this father, Bart built walls around his heart. He couldn’t see hope. Using Bart Millard’s story of pain redeemed, brokenness restored, and God glorified, you can guide your church to recall their past wounds, reorient their present identity, and reimagine their future. Help your community finally see themselves through God’s eyes and find healing in his approval, purpose, and eternal hope.

Will I know my loved ones in heaven?, by Charles Betters- Dr. Betters answers the question, "When I die, will I know my loved ones when I get to heaven?"

One Thousand Gifts, by Ann Voskamp- In everything, give thanks. How do those four word strike you? As naïve? Infuriating? Impossible? Offensive? For Ann Voskamp, the notion of being able to give thanks was lost between her gnawing anger and deep resentment toward God for his unfair dealings in her life and the lives of others. Having suffered from agoraphobia and anxiety for much of her life, she despaired of finding a joy of her own. Then, a friend dared her to write a list of a thousand blessings. Over the months that followed, she made some profound discoveries.
